**General Observations:** Available returns from 35 Hoosier regiments, for 3rd Quarter 1863, show a surprising number of NCO and Musician swords listed as being on-hand although many of these units had already been in the field for more than two years. As late as the period covering the Tullahoma and Chattanooga-Chickamauga Campaigns, some Indiana regiments were reporting significant, to nearly-complete, complements of issue swords. Among these were the 31st, 63rd, 70th, 85th, and 101st IVI's. Interestingly, *all* of these units served exclusively in the West with the exception of the 14th IVI, which served exclusively in the Eastern Theater until its muster-out in June 1864, and the 63rd IVI, which was briefly attached to the Army of the Potomac (May-September 1862) and thereafter served in the West.
