
The Frightened Krooman—A Case for Lord Napier.

The Captain of the brig *Flora*, of Newcastle Me., who brought away from the Coast of Africa, (Dix Cove,) a native Krooman named JOHN DAVIS, without permission of the Consul or authorities, and without entering him among his crew, has had his vessel seized by the United States Marshal for a violation of the law against the Slave trade. A warrant against her captain is also out. JOHN DAVIS is properly a British subject, as the Kroo country is under British rule, and all the natives are marked with india ink from the top of the forehead to the tip of the nose, and their two upper incisors are filed to distinguish them from all other tribes. By these marks they can be claimed by the British Consul in any country. JOHN DAVIS bears these marks, and if necessary, may, we suppose, claim the protection of the English Consul.
